

POLICE BLOTTER

March 5- Officer Ronald Sanna and Detective Marcus Owens are investigating a burglary which took place between 10:00am and 12:15pm in the 700 block of Eayrestown Road. While the homeowners were out, unknown person(s) entered the residence and removed property. Anyone with information or who may have observed anything unusual during this time frame in the area is asked to contact the police department.

March 4- Sergeant Edward Begolly and Officer Ronald Sanna attempted to serve an arrest warrant on Sean Moss, 34, of the Friendship Inn. While at the room, Roseanna Carter, 38, also of the Friendship Inn answered the door. Carter told the officers that Moss was not in the room and permitted them to search. Moss was found hiding in the room at which time both Moss and Carter were arrested. Moss was charged with hindering his own apprehension along with the warrants. Carter was charged with Obstruction of Justice for attempting to conceal Moss' location and attempting to prevent his arrest. Carter was charged and released pending court. Moss was charged and turned over to Burlington Township police on their warrant.

March 4- Officer Bryan Norcross is investigating damage to a mailbox of a residence in the 400 block of Maple Grove Boulevard. The mailbox was damaged by what appeared to be fireworks ignited inside of it.

March 3- Officer Stephen Cittadini is investigating a fraud in which the victim in Lumberton has had money removed from their bank account. The money is being removed by unsuspecting person(s). As previously reported, people are being contacted and asked to "work from home" or to be a "secret shopper". The person receives a check and is told to cash the check at their bank, keep a certain portion of the money, and then to send the remaining amount to the "company" or "boss". These checks are often stolen or fictitious and could cause the unsuspecting "employee" to be charged with a criminal offense. *Once again, if you are contacted by a person or company asking you to participate in check cashing or any money exchange, please contact the police department immediately!*

March 3- Officer Stephen Cittadini charged Christine Slakie, 31, of Caraway Court with Driving While Intoxicated. Ms. Slakie was also charged with Speeding and was processed and released pending court.

March 2- Officer Michael Dickson stopped a vehicle on Bobby's Run Boulevard for a motor vehicle violation. During the course of the stop, it was found that the driver, age 17, of Lumberton and the passenger, Kyle Rodier, 18, of Glenwood Road, Lumberton were in possession of a small amount of marijuana. Both were charged with Possession of Marijuana and Drug Paraphernalia. The driver was also charged with motor vehicle violations. Both were released pending court.

March 2- Officers took several reports of fireworks being ignited inside of mailboxes along Thornhill Drive. Some of the mailboxes had been damaged. Anyone with information on this case is requested to contact the police department.

Disorderly Conduct and Littering. Ragone was acting disorderly and using profanity at the Hess Gas Station and the On-The-Go Car Wash on Route 38. Ragone also threw items on the ground while disregarding Corporal Craig's direction to cease. Ragone was released pending court.

February 25- Officer John Cidoni stopped a vehicle on Route 38 and subsequently charged the driver with possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of CDS in a motor vehicle. The driver, Joseph Mari, 18, of Kensington Drive, Eastampton was released pending court.

February 25- Officer Doug Lemyre is investigating a fraud which took place via e-mail. The victim was notified via email and was asked to be a "Secret Shopper". The victim was to receive a check from their "employer (scammer)". The victim was to cash the check at their bank, retain a portion thereof, and return the rest to his "company". This check is either stolen or fictitious and the victim would be used to obtain real cash for the bad check. ***This type of scam is occurring more frequently and everyone should be wary. Keep in mind the old adage "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is."***

February 21: Officer Doug Lemyre arrested James Durham, 4th, 24, of Plum Street, Vincentown for Driving While Intoxicated. Durham was processed and released pending appearance in the Lumberton Township Municipal Court. Durham was also charged with Reckless Driving, Failure to Maintain a Lane, and Failure to Wear a Seatbelt

February 19: Officer Edward Vincent and Detective Marcus Owens charged Barry Donaldson, Jr, 18, of Eastern Lane, Willingboro, Daquan Brown, 18, of Clubhouse Drive, Willingboro, and a juvenile with Theft by Deception, Fraud, and Conspiracy. They attempted to cash a fraudulent check at the TD Bank in the Lumberton Plaza. The juvenile was released to a custodian pending court while Donaldson and Brown posted bail and were released pending court.

February 12- While on patrol, Officer John Cidoni found the Radio Shack in the Lumberton Plaza had been broken into. The investigation revealed that several items had been removed from the store with a value in excess of \$850.00.

February 12- Officer Michael Dickson stopped a vehicle for speeding along Route 38. The driver provided a fictitious name to Officer Dickson. The driver, Clelia Voira, 47, of Edgewood Place, Southampton was arrested for providing false information to Officer Dickson. Ms. Voira was also charged with speeding and had several active warrants for her arrest. Ms. Voira was lodged into the Burlington County Jail.

February 10- Police officers as well as the Lumberton Township Fire Department and the Lumberton Township Emergency Squad responded to the Travel Inn on Route 38 for a reported fire. The fire caused damage to the 300 building of the Travel Inn and several people were evacuated from the rooms. No injuries ere reported and all of the displaced persons were moved to other rooms. The cause of the fire is being investigated by the Lumberton Township Fire Marshal's Office and the Lumberton Township Detective Bureau.

February 11- Officer Doug Lemyre charged David Ragone, 18, of Main Street, Lumberton with attempting to purchase alcohol while under age 21. Ragone was charged and released pending court.

February 6: Officer Michael Dickson and Corporal Mark Long responded to the Travel Inn for a report of a subject out of control and destroying property in a motel room. The officers made contact with James Mower, 49, of Lumberton in the room. Mr. Mower became combative with officers and was taken into custody. Mr. Mower was charged with Resisting Arrest, Possession of Hypodermic Syringes, and Criminal Mischief.

February 2: Officer Douglas Lemyre charged Bobby Raczkowski, Jr., 23, of N. Cumberland Avenue in Hainesport for Driving While Intoxicated.

February 2: Officer Michael Dickson is investigating a criminal mischief and vandalism which happened at Freeman Park. Person(s) removed a door to the skating rink and disassembled a hockey net. Officer Dickson reassembled the net and will be following up on the case.

January 26: Officer Stephen Cittadini is investigating damage done to a sod farm on Landing Street. A vehicle described as a large Dodge Pickup truck, light blue in color, with a lift kit drove across the property doing damage to the sod.
